In your final project, you will work on a real health challenge connected to your local community.

You will also have access to optional short courses in digital skills, employability, and entrepreneurship.

Eligibility Requirement

The programme especially welcomes applicants who have faced challenges such as financial hardship, displacement, or caring responsibilities.

- Live in a Sub-Saharan African country
- Have completed secondary school with required passes in key subjects (Nigeria WAEC: C6 or above; Nigeria NECO: C6 or above; Ghana WASSCE: C6 or above; Kenya KCSE: C or above; South Africa NSC: 4 or above)
- Have internet access and a phone or computer
- Able to set aside regular weekly time to attend sessions and meet deadlines
- Are not currently enrolled in university
- Are motivated to study and contribute positively to your community

What happens after the programme?

Successful students can progress to:

- Undergraduate study
- Diploma or technical programmes
- Health-related employment pathways
- Further professional training

Progression opportunities will vary by country and institution.
